

We're a group of disgruntled Muni riders who have had guite enough, thank you, of the slow, unreliable service Muni provides San Francisco bus and streetcar riders. Perhaps you're familiar with this sentiment.

When Muni lets us down, we can't simply take our business elsewhere, much as we'd like to. Unfortunately, the only real alternatives to Muni for many riders are taxis and the automobile, both of which are expensive and bad for the environment.



So we formed a riders' association to stand up for the needs of the commuter.

Our organization, **RESCUE MUNI**, now has several hundred members. In our short time in existence, we've:

measured Muni per-

formance from the rider's perspective (1997 Riders' Survey - see graph at right);

 represented the rider at public forums abour SF transit and in the media:

 directly lobbied Muni Director Emilio Cruz and Transport Workers' Union leaders to implement low-

cost improvements to Muni service; among many other projects.

But we need YOUR help.

To make San Francisco the "Transit First" city that it claims to be, we need your help. Organized, we can demand accountability from those who work for us; divided, all we'll have are campaign promises, and we all know what those are worth.

 Structural Reform of Muni - SF think tank SPUR recently proposed a restructuring of Muni, and Supervisor Yaki is holding hearings on the issue this summer. Help us lobby for improvements that put the rider first. • Muni Watchdog - help us make sure a riders' representative attends all city meetings and public forums on transit issues.

· Surveys - help us track Muni performance and publish reliable, objective statistics.

And, of course, we have ample meetings that you can attend - if you have time.
